

Silence for reflection will follow the sermon.

The Presentation

After the sermon, while the bishops and people sit, representatives of the diocese and province (bishops, priests, deacons and lay persons), standing before the archbishop, present the bishop-elect, saying,

Greg, bishop in the Church of God,
the clergy and people of the Diocese of
Edmonton trusting in the guidance of the
Holy Spirit, have chosen Stephen London to be a
bishop and chief pastor.
We therefore ask you to lay your hands upon him
and in the power of the Holy Spirit
to consecrate him a bishop
in the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

The archbishop then directs that testimonials of the election be read. When the reading of thetestimonials is ended, the archbishop requires the following promise from the bishop-elect.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I, Stephen London, chosen bishop of the Church and see of Edmonton, solemnly declare that I do believe the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada; and I do pledge myself to render due obedience to the Metropolitan of Rupert's Land and to his successors. So help me God, through Jesus Christ.

The bishop-elect then signs the above declaration in the sight of all present. The Chancellor adds his signature as witness. The Congregation stands.

Archbishop

Brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, you have heard testimony given that Stephen London has been duly and lawfully elected to be a bishop of the Church of God to serve in the Diocese of Edmonton. You have been assured of his suitability and that the Church has approved him for this sacred responsibility. Nevertheless, if any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it now be made known.

If no objection is made, the archbishop continues,

Archbishop Is it your will that we ordain Stephen a bishop?

All It is.

Archbishop Will you uphold Stephen as bishop?

All We will.

The Examination

All now sit except the bishop-elect, who stands facing the bishops. The archbishop addresses him.

Archbishop

Stephen, the people have chosen you and have affirmed their trust in you by acclaiming your election. A bishop in God's holy Church is called to be one with the apostles in proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel, and to testify to Christ's sovereignty as Lord of lords and King of kings.

You are called to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church; to celebrate and to provide for the administration of the sacraments of the new covenant; to ordain priests and deacons, and to join in ordaining bishops; and to be in all things a faithful pastor and wholesome example for the entire flock of Christ.

With your fellow bishops you will share in the leadership of the Church throughout the world. Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope. Your joy will be to follow him who came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of bishop?

Bishop-elect I am so persuaded.

The following questions are then addressed to the bishop-elect by one or more of the bishops.

Archishop Will you accept this call and fulfill this trust in obedience to Christ?

Bishop-elect I will obey Christ, and will serve in his name.

Archbishop Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the study of holy scripture, that you

may have the mind of Christ?

Bishop-elect I will, for he is my help.

Archbishop Will you boldly proclaim and interpret the gospel of Christ, enlightening

the minds and stirring up the conscience of your people?

Bishop-elect I will, in the power of the Spirit.

Archbishop As a chief priest and pastor, will you encourage and support all baptized

people in their gifts and ministries, nourish them from the riches of God's

grace, pray for them without ceasing, and celebrate with them the sacraments of our redemption?

I will, in the name of Christ, the shepherd and bishop of our souls.

Archbishop Will you guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church?

Bishop-elect I will, for the love of God.

Archbishop Will you share with your fellow bishops in the government of the whole

Church; will you sustain your fellow presbyters and take counsel with them; will you guide and strengthen the deacons and all others who

minister in the Church?

Bishop-elect I will, by the grace given me.

Archbishop Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and strangers,

and defend those who have no helper?

Bishop-elect I will, for the sake of Jesus Christ.

All stand. The archbishop then says,

Stephen, through these promises you have committed yourself to God, to serve his Church in the office of bishop. We therefore call upon you, chosen to be a guardian of the Church's faith, to lead us in confessing that faith.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit

he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father.
With the Father and the Son
he is worshipped and glorified.
He has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic
and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism

The Consecration of the Bishop

All remain standing, except the bishop-elect, who kneels before the archbishop. The other bishops stand to the right and left of the archbishop. The archbishop says,

The scriptures tell us that our Saviour Christ spent the whole night in prayer before he chose and sent forth his twelve apostles. Likewise, the apostles prayed before they appointed Matthias to be one of their number. Let us, therefore, follow their examples, and offer our prayers to Almighty God before we ordain Stephen for the work to which we trust the Holy Spirit has called him.

The bishop-elect kneels on the floor; people are invited to join in prayer by kneeling as they are able.

For all who fear God and believe in you, Lord Christ, that our divisions may cease and that all may be one as you and the Father are one, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For the mission of the Church, that in faithful witness it may preach the gospel to the ends of the earth, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For all who search for the Wisdom of God, that all our paths may be illuminated by the light of truth, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For ourselves: for the forgiveness of our sins, and for the grace of the Holy Spirit to amend our lives, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For all who have died in the communion of the Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Rejoicing in the fellowship of the ever-blessed Virgin Mary, the apostles and all the saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life to Christ our God.

To you, O Lord.

The archbishop prays,

Almighty and eternal God, ruler of all things in heaven and earth, mercifully accept the prayers of your people, and strengthen us to do your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

A period of silent prayer follows.

The archbishop stands with the bishops who assist him, the bishop-elect kneeling before him; he stretches out his hands toward him, and begins the Prayer of Consecration.

We praise and glorify you, almighty Father, because you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession, a royal priesthood, a universal Church.

We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls.

We praise and glorify you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he has given his gifts abundantly to your people, making some, apostles; some, prophets; some, evangelists; some, pastors and teachers; to equip them for the work of ministry and to build up his Body.

And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant to share this ministry entrusted to your Church.

Here the archbishop and other bishops lay their hands on the head of the bishop-elect, and the archbishop says,

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Stephen, whom we consecrate in your name to the office and work of a bishop in the Church.

The archbishop continues, with hands extended,

Almighty Father, fill this your servant with the grace and power which you gave to your apostles, that he may lead those committed to his charge in proclaiming

the gospel of salvation. Through him increase your Church, renew itsministry, and unite its members in a holy fellowship of truth and love. Enable him as a true shepherd to feed and govern your flock; make him wise as a teacher, and steadfast as a guardian of its faith and sacraments. Guide and direct him in presiding at the worship of your people. Give him humility, that he may use his authority to heal, not to hurt; to build up, not to destroy. Defend him from all evil, that, as a ruler over your household and an ambassador for Christ, he may stand before you blameless, and finally, with all your servants, enter your eternal joy.

Accept our prayer, most merciful Father, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever.

Icon of the Reconciliation of Saints Peter and Paul: presented by ecumenical guests
We present to you this icon as a sign of your place with us in the one, holy,

Baptismal Waters: presented by lay leaders of the diocese

Receive this water as a reminder that you share this ministry within the ministry of all the baptised. Raise each one of us up to join with you in leading and caring for the Body of Christ, as every member does its part.

Pastoral Staff: presented by the Metropolitan

Receive this staff as a sign of your pastoral office; keep watch over the whole flock in which the Holy Spirit has appointed you to shepherd the Church of God.
